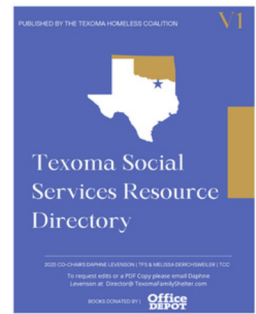


- More than 30% of our residents are children.

The Smith Training Center opened, hosting educational courses, medical screenings, and numerous nonprofit events at no cost.



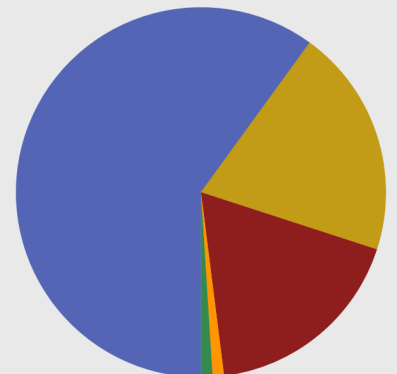
TFS updated and distributed the Texoma Social Services Directory to nonprofits, social services agencies, etc.

Resident Success

- **Mr. K** had been living in his car and was in poor health when he arrived. He had developed a blood clot in his leg. At his intake, our Case Manager noticed the leg and immediately took him to Texoma Medical Center. He was admitted to the hospital that night and needed emergency surgery. With treatment for both his physical and mental health, **he recovered**, contributed to the shelter community, **secured employment**, and **obtained stable housing**.
- **Ms. C** had a history of depression, PTSD, medical issues, and speech impairments. While staying at TFS, she **accessed mental and physical health services** at TCC, received eyeglasses through the Sherman Evening Lions Club, and **regained confidence**. She helped staff and fellow residents, secured housing assistance, and is **now living independently** in Grayson County.

Letter from a Former Resident

"On behalf of myself and my family, I want to say that **Texoma Family Shelter** has **been extremely helpful and supportive to my family** during our time of being displaced and financially strained. The staff there, from the social workers to the resident assistants, were helpful, polite and understanding. Resources were available. They have an open door policy to listen to your needs and concerns. **Most importantly we were safe and treated as people.** My children and myself were given a private room, provided with more than enough food. **Yes there were rules! But they were fair and reasonable** and in place for our safety and others. They have a very organized system, that I believe works. **If you are goal oriented and honest this is the perfect place** for anyone trying to get back on their feet and move towards the next chapter of their life. We appreciate EVERY STAFF MEMBER who assisted us during that time! "

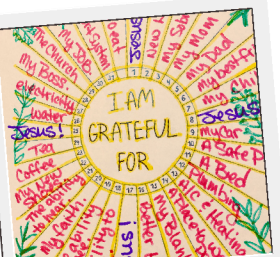
